

TENNYSON SAMRAJ, PhD

Professor of Philosophy

Tennyson Samraj is a lecturer in the philosophy department at Burman University where he routinely teaches courses on both philosophy and religion. He carried out his studies in India, earning his PhD in Philosophy at the Pune University. He has traveled extensively with his students across the globe, teaching about the various ideologies and paradigms that inform different cultures. His personal journeys have taken him to every continent on the planet, including Antarctica. Dr Samraj's passions lie with his students in the classroom and his artwork depicting portraits of many great and noteworthy figures in history.

BRUCE BOYD. DMin

Professor of Religious Studies

Bruce Boyd is a professor of Religious Studies at Burman University who specializes in conflict transformation - more commonly referred to as conflict resolution. He teaches courses in applied Christianity in addition to giving presentations in various venues, serving also as a conflict coach and mediator. Dr Boyd graduated with a Doctor of Ministry degree from Andrews University in 1995 and was recognized in 2003 as a Certified Christian Conciliator by Peacemaker Ministries.

Dr. Wass trained in Clinical Neuropsychology at the University of Windsor. He has been actively teaching as an Associate Professor of Psychology at Burman University for over 20 years, as well as supervising both undergraduate and graduate level students in both clinical and research activities over the years. 
