The Elephant in the Room: US Expansion and Canadian History

Pierre Trudeau famously said in 1969, "Living next to you [the USA] is in some ways like sleeping with an elephant. No matter how friendly and even-tempered is the beast, if I can call it that, one is affected by every twitch and grunt."

With the president-elect's recent comments about making Canada the 51st state, today we find the elephant poised to roll over in our direction. Canadians must reflect upon the nature of this longstanding relationship and ask ourselves whether Canada is worth preserving as a distinct sovereign state. Since the American Revolution and the Loyalist "counter-revolution" in the 1770s, Canadian nationality was shaped by efforts to resist becoming American. But after the 1940s we have grown closer economically, militarily, and culturally to the point that by 1965 Canadian philosopher George Grant predicted that Canada would ultimately be absorbed into the American Empire. In this talk, Dr. James Forbes will give an overview of this history and explain why the next few years may require Canadians to decide whether we should revitalize our nationality or allow it to end.
