





THE BURMAN MOSAIC: THE CULTURAL COLLECTION

Cultural integration at Burman is visible in the daily "rhythm of the hilltop." It is found in the **International Office**, a hub where students from around the world find more than just immigration advice—they find a "home away from home." Initiatives like the International Student Spotlight celebrate the personal journeys of students, turning "the stranger" into a classmate with a story.

From the cultural clubs of an active student association (BUSA) such as Latino, Caribbean, Haitian, Korean, and Indigenous to name a few, are not just social outlets; they are educational platforms that invite the entire campus to experience different perspectives. The annual Cultural Collision week culminating in a cultural expo, this event is a sensory celebration of diversity. With over 40 plus cultures on campus, it is represented through food, fashion, and performance, it moves cultural awareness from a textbook concept to a lived experience.

The Centre for Peace and Justice plays a critical role in this development. By hosting the Herr Lecture Series and the Peacebuilders program, the university encourages students to grapple with difficult questions regarding human rights and systemic inequity. This intellectual rigor ensures that cultural sensitivity is not just about "being nice," but about "doing justice."

A vital component of cultural awareness at Burman is the recognition of the land. By acknowledging its location on **Treaty 6 territory**, the traditional home of the Cree, Dene, Blackfoot, Saulteaux, and Nakota Sioux, Burman invites its students into the ongoing process of Truth and Reconciliation. This grounding in local history is essential for international and domestic students alike to understand their place in the Canadian cultural fabric.

As the 2026 academic year progresses, I borrow the Jamaican motto, "***Out of Many, One People***" continues to resonate. Cultural integration at Burman University is an active, ongoing project. It is found in the cafeteria's vegetarian menu that respects diverse dietary traditions, in the Ubuntu choir's spirituals, and in the quiet conversations between dorm mates from different continents.

By fostering an environment where cultural differences are not just tolerated but celebrated as essential to the university's mission, Burman is preparing students to "**Think**" globally, "**Believe**" in everyone and; "**Act**" locally with compassion in an increasingly ever-changing and interconnected world.
