

BURMAN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS SAFETY DEPARTMENT IS BEGINNING TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR THOSE INTERESTED IN BEING PART OF THE SECURITY TEAM FOR THE 23-24 SCHOOL YEAR. INTERVIEWS WILL BEGIN ON FEB. 13TH AND CONTINUE UNTIL POSITIONS ARE FILLED.

Campus safety is looking for individuals interested in helping to provide a safer community for their campus family members. Burman security guards are an integral part of the campus safety team and help to provide the campus community with peace of mind that incidents that occur overnight are addressed and that the appropriate people are notified.

Security guards are provided thorough training and are assisted through the process of becoming licensed security guards in the province of Alberta as well as 22 hours of additional on-the-job training required to be successful guards here on campus. We also provide work to students during the summer and over the Christmas break, with preference given to current employees.

Some of the duties of a Burman University security guard include:

- building lockup
- safety checks to watch for maintenance and other emergent issues
- addressing emergency events during their shifts
- checking and ensuring emergency exits and equipment are in proper working order
- opening buildings as required for those needing to enter buildings after hours.
- The ideal candidate for this position would be a student with proven leadership capability, self-driven with strong ethics and a desire to serve their community.

Applicants must:

- be a student of Burman University and have been a student for at least one semester
- have shown good citizenship during their time on campus
- Preference is given to applicants who:
- have a driver's license and can be insured through Burman university's vehicle insurance
- are currently licensed security guards either in Alberta or another province
- have worked previously in positions of responsibility

Are you looking for your next challenge? Do you have strong customer service skills? Are you experienced with diverse and vulnerable groups? Are your computer skills exceptional? Do you pride yourself on your organizational, problem-solving skills and communication skills? Do you like working in a fast-paced team environment and thrive at multitasking? If so, we have the opportunity for you!

As a member of the Support & Financial Services Coordinator (SFSC) unit, you will share responsibility for determining ongoing eligibility for the Income Support program. This includes assisting Albertans towards realizing their action plan goals, through the provision of support services, and the issuance of financial benefits.

In this role, you will most frequently interact with clients by telephone, review documents, review files and reports, and utilize several computer applications and systems simultaneously. You will monitor and support the Albertans' action plan by ensuring the Albertan is committed and accountable for progress towards their self¬ sufficiency.

In order to be successful in this role, you will need to be able to research, understand and apply legislation; have knowledge of the Income and Employment Support Act and be skilled in assessment, critical thinking, conflict resolution and active listening.

Responsibilities involve the following:
