BURMAN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS SAFETY DEPARTMENT IS BEGINNING TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR THOSE INTERESTED IN BEING PART OF THE SECURITY TEAM FOR THE 24-25 SCHOOL YEAR. Campus safety is looking for individuals interested in helping to provide a safer community for their campus family members. Burman security guards are an integral part of the campus safety team and help to provide the campus community with peace of mind that incidents that occur overnight are addressed and that the appropriate people are notified.

Security guards are provided thorough training and are assisted through the process of becoming licensed security guards in the province of Alberta as well as 22 hours of additional on-the-job training required to be successful guards here on campus. We also provide work to students during the summer and over the Christmas break, with preference given to current employees.

Some of the duties of a Burman University security guard include:

- · building lockup
- · safety checks to watch for maintenance and other emergent issues
- · addressing emergency events during their shifts
- · checking and ensuring emergency exits and equipment are in proper working order
- opening buildings as required for those needing to enter buildings after hours.
- The ideal candidate for this position would be a student with proven leadership capability, self-driven with strong ethics and a desire to serve their community.

Applicants must:

- be a student of Burman University and have been a student for at least one semester
- have shown good citizenship during their time on campus
- Preference is given to applicants who:
- · have a driver's license and can be insured through Burman university's vehicle insurance
- are currently licensed security guards either in Alberta or another province
- have worked previously in positions of responsibility

Students: It pays to do your taxes!

Heading back to school? Make sure tax literacy is on your course calendar! Understanding taxes will help you make smart decisions about your finances – how to put money in your pocket and help you save for a holiday, a car, or a house of your own.

Money in your pocket

If you are 19 years or older, you may be eligible to receive a <u>GST/HST credit payment</u> four times a year to help with your expenses, even if you do not earn any income.

Get the <u>Canada Carbon Rebate</u>, a tax-free amount to help eligible individuals and families offset the cost of the federal pollution pricing.

Have a child under 18? The Canada child benefit helps with the cost of raising your family.

Improve your tax literacy

<u>Learn about your taxes</u>: a self-paced online learning tool to help you understand what taxes are, how to do them, and what's in it for you.

Access free webinars: engaging, user-centric content prepared for students.

Mind your business

If you work while in school, most of your income—like wages, tips, and gratuities—is taxable. Take action now to save yourself headaches at tax time.

Reporting all your income is important and even tips count! Make sure you know what needs to be reported on your taxes.

If you work through an app or a website, you might be considered self-employed. Different tax rules apply when you're self -employed. Learn more: Starting to work – Learn about your taxes - Canada.ca

Keep your records for 6 years. This includes emails, contracts, and receipts—about your income sources. It helps at tax time!

Maximize your deductions and claims

There were over 2.4 million claims for tuition, education and textbook expenses in the 2023 tax year. This includes both claims made by students and claims transferred to other qualified individuals. Did you claim what you're entitled to? If not,

16+ and taking post-secondary courses? You can claim <u>tuition credit</u> to reduce what you owe or you could carry it forward. You can also transfer an amount to your parent, grandparent or spouse, which in turn can reduce their taxes. It's a win -win!

Moved for school? You may be able to claim <u>moving expenses</u> if your new home is at least 40 km closer to school. <u>Paid interest on student loans</u>? You might claim that too, or you could carry it forward and claim it later.

Use our digital tools for easier access to your tax information

My Account is a cool tool that lets you check the next benefit payment date, the status of your tax return, and keep your personal information up to date.

Use your cell phone and a government issued photo to register for CRA sign-in services including My Account.

Sign up for direct deposit in My Account and get your tax refund and benefit payments deposited directly into your account.

Need help? Free tax clinics can help

Free tax clinics (in person or virtual) are offered between March and April across Canada, but some are open year-round. Find the right clinic for you.
