The School of Education at Burman University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position in Education. Instructional roles include teaching undergraduate and after-degree Education courses. In addition to teaching, the successful applicant will be expected to be actively engaged in research and

publication.

The successful candidate will teach courses in curriculum and instruction to elementary and secondary majors, supervise education majors in their practicum experience, advise and mentor students, pursue an active program of scholarly inquiry, including presentations at conferences and publishing in scholarly/academic journals, and participating in all committees related to the BEd program. Desirable qualifications include experience in online course preparation and delivery, graduate course preparation and delivery, graduate program application process, teaching Math Education courses, and experience with culturally diverse students.

Other responsibilities include service on university-wide committees. The successful candidate will firmly commit to Christian higher education and be a dedicated Seventh-day Adventist Christian committed to integrating his or her faith with teaching and scholarship. Applicants should be able to use technology effectively in teaching and learning, bring real-world experiences to the classroom and student research projects, work collaboratively, and demonstrate evidence of scholarly activity. Applicants must be eligible to work in Canada.

An earned PhD in Education or a closely related field is preferred. Candidates

must have K-12 teaching experience. Preference will be given to candidates with post-secondary teaching and research experience. A demonstrated commitment to Seventh-day Adventist education, community service, and research and writing

for scholarly publications is required.

statement of the candidate's research agenda and teaching competencies; 4) a sample of scholarly writing; 5) teaching evaluations or evidence of teaching effectiveness; 6) and the names and addresses of three referees that can speak to
