**Description:** Burman University's Psychology Program is seeking applications

for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position in Psychology. The role involves teaching a broad range of psychology and statistics courses such as Introduction to Psychology, Learning and Motivation, Adult Development and Aging, Introduction to Statistics, Multivariate Analysis, and Correlational Methods. The successful candidate should also have experience with practicum development and

supervision.

In line with the Adventist faith's strong focus on health and well-being, the Psychology department collaborates closely with the Biology and Wellness departments to foster theory, research, and practice in Lifestyle Medicine and Flourishing. The ideal candidate will have a keen interest in Positive Psychology, Health, Wellness, and Flourishing, with a focus on education, research, practice, and faculty collaboration. They should be committed to excellence in teaching, advising, and mentoring students, and be willing to contribute to academic advising and to serve on university

committees.

Qualifications: The successful candidate must have a strong commitment to

Christian higher education and be a dedicated Seventh-day

Adventist Christian who integrates their faith with their teaching and scholarly work. Applicants should be skilled in using technology in teaching, bring real-world experience to the classroom and student research projects, work well collaboratively, and show evidence of scholarly activity. Experience teaching online is also required. Applicants must be eligible to work in Canada, eligible for registration as a Registered Psychologist in Alberta, and be members of relevant professional organizations.

An earned PhD in Psychology with a generalist orientation is preferred. Preference will be given to candidates with post-secondary teaching experience and research experience. A demonstrated commitment to Seventh-day Adventist education, to community service, and to research and writing for scholarly publications is expected.
